Kevin Wilhite, Planner IV for the Department of Planning, noted that the current Fire Station #12 building was constructed in 1975 and is 6,630 square feet. It will be expanded to 10,550 square feet. He presented slides depicting the location of the site, surrounding property, existing and proposed site connections and access points, proposed site improvements, a deceleration lane that will be added on West End Drive in the vicinity of the site, plans to save existing vegetation on the site, and construction materials that will be used for building renovation and expansion. Michael Verdu, Capital Projects Manager for the Department of General Services, provided more detail on the project's construction phases, the building's design and exterior elevations, and the schedule for bidding and completing the project. The County will be seeking Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) silver certification for this project from the United States Green Building Council.

Mr. Hazelett, Mr. Verdu, and Jerry Walker, Energy Manager for the Department of General Services, responded to questions from the Board concerning estimated energy savings from LEED designed buildings and additional construction costs associated with LEED certification.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

Mr. Glover commented that neighbors contiguous to this site are very happy with the idea of enlarging the facility and enhancing services. He pointed out that there has never been an accident at this fire station even though it fronts a collector roadway.

He, Mr. Petrini, Solid Waste Division Director Steve Yob, and Mr. Hazelett responded to further questions from the Board relating to terms of the lease, citizen notification of the proposed generating plant through the conditional use permit (CUP) process, the revenue that this project will generate for the County, INGENCO's experience in producing methane gas from landfills, the life cycle for methane gas generation, the type of liquid fuel that is used for pilot injection technology, and the impact of this project on future uses of the landfill site.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

Richard Knapp, an attorney with Knapp and Associates, addressed the Board on behalf of his client, Southwood Builders. He asked the Board to deny this resolution that had been proffered by the County Manager and supported by the County Attorney and to direct County staff to pay his client the money that was owed for a job well done. Mr. Knapp focused his presentation on factual issues rather than legal issues. He contended that the County did not obtain permanent power from Dominion Virginia Power by April 5, 2005 pursuant to the terms of the contract. Mr. Knapp elaborated at length on this contention and stated that the library staff occupied the facility prior to the certificate of occupancy being issued. He debated several points contained in the staff summary of this agenda item.

Mr. Kaechele noted that the Board had discussed this matter in a work session prior to this meeting, had reviewed the County's position, and was not here to debate the many claims and counterclaims that had been made. Mr. Hazelett commented briefly on the resolution before the Board.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 145-09 – see attached resolution.

146-09 Introduction of Resolution – Receipt of Requests for Amendments to the FY 2008-09 Annual Fiscal Plan: June, 2009.

Director of the Management and Budget Division Gene Walter, Mr. Hazelett, and Fire Chief Ed Smith responded to questions from the Board pertaining to how donations to the County are maintained and tracked, how the County budgets and allocates hotel/occupancy tax revenues designated for the Richmond Center expansion, how the County informs the public about the Real Estate Advantage Program (REAP), and the status of the Division's Eyes for Fire program that funds thermal imaging cameras. Mr. Glover expressed disbelief that the County will be able to increase its total appropriation for the REAP program from \$7.2 million to \$8.8 million during these depressed economic times. He noted that more than 50 percent of the County's 65 and over population currently qualify for tax relief under the program. On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 146-09 – see attached resolution.

Mr. Kaechele called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

Mr. Hazelett briefly reviewed the two items on the special meeting agenda.

Proposed Plan of Development for Fire Station No. 12

Mr. Hazelett recognized Kevin Wilhite, a Planner IV with the Department of Planning, who noted that the current Fire Station #12 building was constructed in 1975 and is 6,630 square feet. It will be expanded to 10,550 square feet. Mr. Wilhite presented slides depicting the location of the site, surrounding property, existing and proposed site connections and access points, site improvements, a deceleration lane that will be added on West End Drive in the vicinity of the site, the proposed landscaping plan, and construction materials that will be used for building renovation and expansion. There was considerable discussion by Board members, Mr. Hazelett, and Art Petrini, Director of Public Utilities, regarding plans to remove the public recycling drop off bins from this site and alternate locations that could be considered.

Jon Tracy, Director of Real Property, advised that the Virginia Home for Boys and Girls has tentatively agreed to allow a public recycling facility to be sited on property owned by the Home. Mrs. O'Bannon pointed out that apartments and churches are excluded from the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority's (CVWMA's) curbside recycling program and that some single-family residents have a need to recycle more frequently than the curbside schedule allows. Mr. Hazelett assured the Board that staff will continue to investigate alternate sites for relocating existing fire station drop off centers. This will be done on a case by case basis as existing fire stations are renovated.

Michael Verdu, Capital Projects Manager for the Department of General Services, continued the slide presentation by providing more detail on the project's construction phases, facility design and exterior elevations, and the schedule for completing the project. The County will be seeking Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) silver certification for this project from the United States Green Building Council. In response to questions from the Board, Mr. Verdu and Mr. Hazelett confirmed that a community meeting had been held on this project and that the Board's public hearing for the Plan of Development (POD) was scheduled for the 7:00 p.m. regular meeting. They also responded to questions pertaining to funding for this project and current trends in the cost of construction contracts.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, the Board approved going into a Closed Meeting at 5:24 p.m. for the following purposes:

The applicant proposes to amend Proffer 2 related to age restrictions to reduce the minimum age restriction from 62 to 55 and amend Proffer 3 related to enforcement of age restrictions. The total number of units would remain the same. The existing zoning is R-5C General Residence District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Commercial Concentration and Environmental Protection Area. The site is in the Enterprise Zone. Acting on a motion by Mr. Archer seconded by Mr. Branin, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors grant the request because the changes do not reduce the original intended purpose of the proffers and the proffers continue to assure a quality form of development. (Deferred from the May 12, 2009 Meeting for Decision Only.)

Resolution – Signatory Authority – Second Amendment to Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services – Fire Station #3

This resolution authorizes the County Manager to execute a second amendment to the February 13, 2008 contract with Teng & Associates, Inc. for architectural and engineering services for Fire Station #3. The original contract sum was \$303,000. The first amendment, in the amount of \$90,510 covering services for LEED certification, was approved January 27, 2009 for a total contract sum of \$393,510.

This second amendment provides additional architectural and engineering services to analyze and review off-site storm water drainage to determine if the existing storm water system can handle the additional water from Fire Station # 3 or if a storm water management system needs to be installed on site. The analysis includes the effect of the storm water discharge from the adjacent upstream property as well as three properties downstream between the fire station and Tuckers Branch. The services include a topographic survey, a right-of-way plat, and revised POD drawings. The negotiated value of these services is \$16,205, resulting in a new contract sum of \$411,635.
