Mr. Hazelett explained to the public that this proposed acquisition of property was part of a master plan for the overall expansion of the County government complex. A juvenile courts facility will be located in this general area.

Mr. Tracy responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele relating to the number of parcels affected by this project for which the County has not yet reached agreement with the property owners.

Mr. Cook, the owner of the property addressed by this resolution, addressed the Board. He provided a timeline and overview of previous negotiations with the consultant of the County's contractor. He also expressed concerns regarding the difficulty he had encountered in getting answers to his questions about the County's need to acquire right-of-way and easements across his property. Mr. Cook also spoke to unresolved drainage issues pertaining to his property. He requested a 30-day deferral of this resolution pending answers to his questions.

Mr. Hazelett assured Mr. Cook that he will receive the information he has requested and that although the County will try every way possible to reach agreement with him the condemnation process needs to move ahead to avoid the potential of delaying the project. Mr. Cook expressed appreciation for the efforts of Jack Beirne with the County's Real Property Department and Donny Johnson with the County's Department of Public Works. In response to a statement made earlier by Mr. Cook, Mr. Glover suggested that the County consider providing Mr. Cook access to the rear of his property in exchange for the right-of-way and easements needed by the County for this project. Mr. Hazelett agreed to follow up on this offer by Mr. Cook as part of the County's negotiations with him. Mr. Cook responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele relating to the size and configuration of Mr. Cook's property and how a proposed permanent drainage easement will impact his property. Mrs. O'Bannon noted that she was impressed with Mr. Tracy and his staff for having resolved a number of condemnation cases.

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 5:03 p.m.

GRTC Transit System Funding

Mrs. O'Bannon recognized Tim Foster, Director of Public Works, who introduced John Lewis, CEO of GRTC; Larry Hagan, Transportation Director of GRTC; Todd Eure, Transportation Development Engineer for the County's Department of Public Works; and Chris Winstead, Assistant Director of the County's Department of Public Works. Mr. Foster narrated a Power Point presentation on the Henrico County FY 2010-2011 Mass Transit Budget, which included slides addressing the FY mass transit operating budget; the cost of GRTC fixed-route service; GRTC Henrico County routes; GRTC average monthly ridership in the County from Fiscal Year (FY) 2005 through FY 2010; cost reduction recommendations; information on two underperforming routes recommended by staff for elimination, Route 92 – Central Gardens Connector and Route 25 – Glenside/Parham/Gaskins Express Circulator; information on a route

to White Oak Village Shopping Center recommended by staff for rerouting; cost reduction recommendations; proposed GRTC fare increases; and next steps. Mr. Foster noted that the County's \$5,036,000 FY 2011 mass-transit operating budget approved by the Board on April 27, 2010 when it approved the County's overall operating budget did not include funds to cover \$701,549 in projected additional costs for the upcoming fiscal year necessary to maintain the existing level of service. To address the anticipated budget shortfall, staff was recommending the elimination of two underperforming routes (Route 92 and 25), rerouting service to White Oak Village Shopping Center, eliminating a total of eight trips a day on two local routes, and eliminating a total of ten trips per day on three express routes. Staff was further proposing that a public hearing for these service eliminations and reductions be held at the June 22, 2010 Board meeting and that the service changes be implemented beginning August 15, 2010. Meanwhile, GRTC will be continuing system-wide efforts to reduce costs and improve efficiencies.

During Mr. Foster's presentation, he and Mr. Eure as well as Mr. Lewis and Mr. Hazelett responded to a number of questions from the Board regarding the marketing of GRTC service within the County, the costs per rider of operating the routes recommended for elimination, taxi service offered by GRTC for express bus riders who because of an emergency need to return to their vehicles during non-peak hours, the proposed rerouting of service to White Oak Village, the cost effectiveness of using private contractors for GRTC's weekdays extended commuter service to Mechanicville and Fredericksburg, the current status of federal and state financial assistance for existing and trial GRTC service, the status of old GRTC buildings, the cost of operating CARE vans, and the feasibility of offering fare discounts to passengers. Mr. Thornton suggested that public transit is not sufficiently marketed to Henrico citizens and that fares are only one dimension of the public transit picture. Mr. Glover commented that it is difficult for GRTC to compete with automobiles in this region in terms of commute times. Mr. Foster and Mr. Lewis responded to further questions from the Board pertaining to public usage of park and ride lots, ridership numbers and service subsidies for routes in the City of Richmond versus those in the County, and transportation alternatives to mass transit where service is eliminated or reduced. Mr. Hazelett noted that staff had worked hard to minimize service reductions in its proposal to address the budget shortfall.

The Board recessed for dinner at 6:06 p.m. and reconvened at 6:13 p.m.

Mr. Hazelett briefly reviewed the public hearing items listed on the agenda for the evening's regular meeting. He advised that staff would be recommending the withdrawal of two items authorizing condemnation proceedings for the North Gayton Road Extension Project because the County had reached settlement with the property owners. He discussed a request by a citizen, Zandra Sharon, who had signed up to speak during the evening's public comment period in regards to her 20-year-old daughter's recent disappearance. Mr. Hazelett noted that Col. Henry Stanley, Chief of Police, had offered to meet personally with Ms. Sharon at her home. Mr. Hazelett responded to questions from the Board relating to the facts and status of this case. He then briefly reviewed the general agenda items for the evening meeting and advised that Mrs. O'Bannon would be announcing the recent passing of a former member and Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, John Waldrop. Mr. Hazelett further advised he would be addressing two matters under Manager's Comments, including a Memorial Day tribute to County personnel who have been called to active military duty since September 11, 2001.

Mrs. O'Bannon mentioned that she had received a request from a constituent who was concerned about Henrico citizens not getting enough airtime from Comcast on the designated public access cable television channel and who wanted the County to request a second public access channel. Mr. Hazelett pointed out that an additional channel would also require another studio. Paul Proto, Director of General Services, clarified that the constituent was not only requesting a separate public access channel for Henrico citizens but also questioning a provision in Comcast's franchise agreement with the City of Richmond that is in apparent conflict with provisions in the company's franchise agreements with adjoining localities. The disputed provision prohibits use of the local Comcast public access studio, which is located in downtown Richmond, by citizens in other localities. Mr. Proto advised that he has requested that Comcast make this studio available to citizens outside the City of Richmond. He and Mr. Hazelett responded to questions and concerns from the Board relating to the condition of the existing Comcast public access studio and the appropriate role of the County in facilitating public access programming on cable television.

- 1. The Director of Public Utilities shall approve the construction plans for public water and sewer prior to beginning any construction of these utilities. The Department of Public Utilities shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any County water or sewer construction.
- 2. The parking lot shall be subject to the requirements of Section 24-98 of the Henrico County Code.
- 3. The parking spaces shall be marked on the pavement surface with four-inch wide white painted traffic lines. All lane lines and parking lines shall be white in color with the exception that those dividing traffic shall be yellow.
- 4. Sufficient, effective usable parking shall be provided. If experience indicates the need, additional parking shall be provided.
- 5. Curb and gutter and necessary storm sewer shall be constructed as shown on approved plans.
- 6. The plan of development shall be revised as annotated on the staff plan dated June 8, 2010, which shall be as much a part of this approval as if its details were fully described herein. Eight (8) sets of revised plans, including the detailed drainage, erosion control and utility plans shall be submitted by the design engineer who prepared the plans to the Department of Planning for final review. Upon notice from the Department of Planning that all comments have been addressed, twenty-one (21) sets of final plans for signature shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for approval signatures.
- 7. The Department of Public Works shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any construction.
- 8. Two copies of an Erosion and Sediment Control Agreement shall be submitted to the Department of Public Works. Approval is required prior to construction plan approval and beginning construction.
- 9. A detailed landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for review and approval prior to the issuance of any occupancy permits.
- 10. All ground cover and landscaping shall be properly maintained in a healthy condition at all times. Dead plant materials shall be removed within a reasonable time and replaced during the normal planting season.
- Prior to the approval of an electrical permit application and installation of the site lighting equipment, a plan including light spread and intensity diagrams and fixture specifications and mounting height details shall be submitted for Department of Planning review and approval.
- 12. All exterior lighting shall be designed and arranged to direct the light and glare away from nearby residential property and streets.
- 13. The site including the parking areas shall be kept clean of litter and debris on a daily basis. Trash container units/litter receptacles and recycling containers shall be maintained with scheduled regular pickups and shall be screened properly on all four sides. The gate(s) shall remain closed except when the receptacle(s) are being filled or serviced and shall be repaired or replaced as necessary. Details shall be included with the final site plan or required landscape plan review and approval.
- 14. Required fire lanes shall be marked and maintained in accordance with the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.

- 15. Traffic control signs shall be provided as indicated on the Planning staff plan. All signs shall be fabricated as shown in <u>The National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways</u> and <u>The Virginia Supplement to The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways</u>.
- 16. The assigned property number shall be displayed so it is easily readable from the street. If assistance is needed with the address, please contact the Department of Planning at 501-4284. The Planning Department must assign all property addresses.

- 24. Vehicles shall be parked only in approved and constructed parking spaces.

Hours of construction shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Construction on Saturday shall be limited to interior work only. There shall be no construction on Sunday. Construction hours shall be posted on a sign at the entrance to the site in both English and Spanish.
- 26. The easements for drainage and utilities as shown on approved plans shall be granted to the County in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to any occupancy permits being issued. The easement plats and any other required information shall be submitted to the County Real Property Agent at least sixty (60) days prior to requesting occupancy permits.

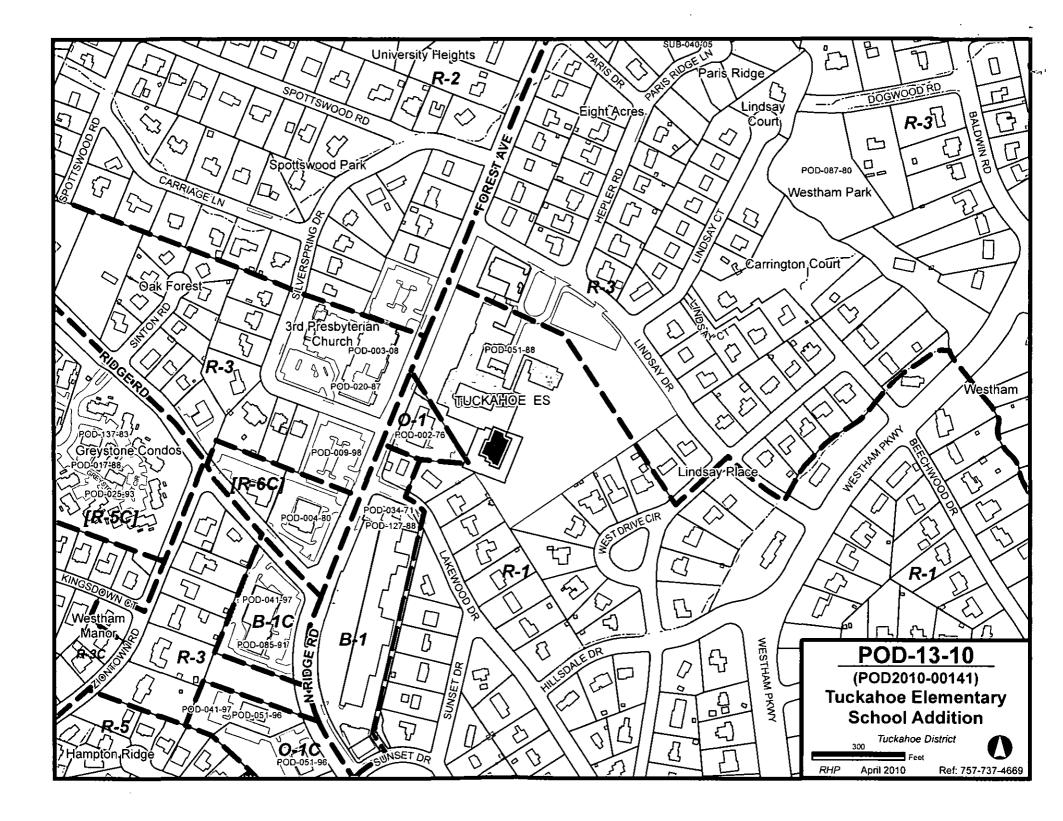

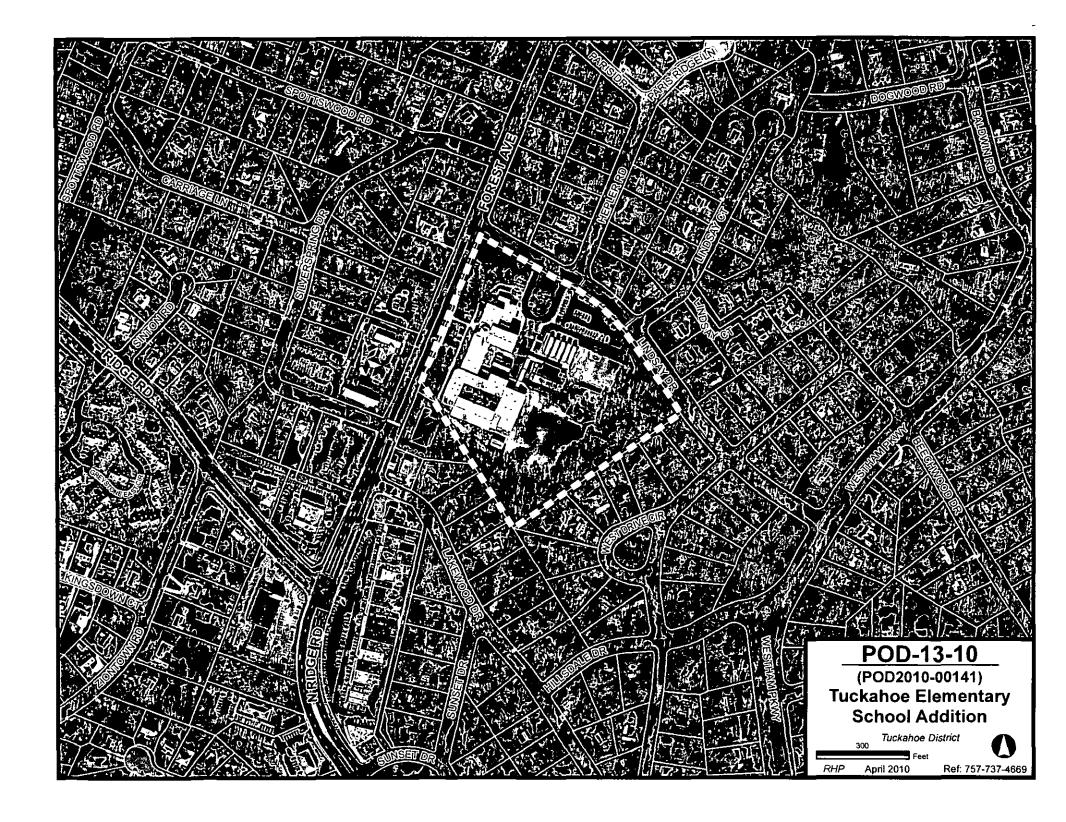

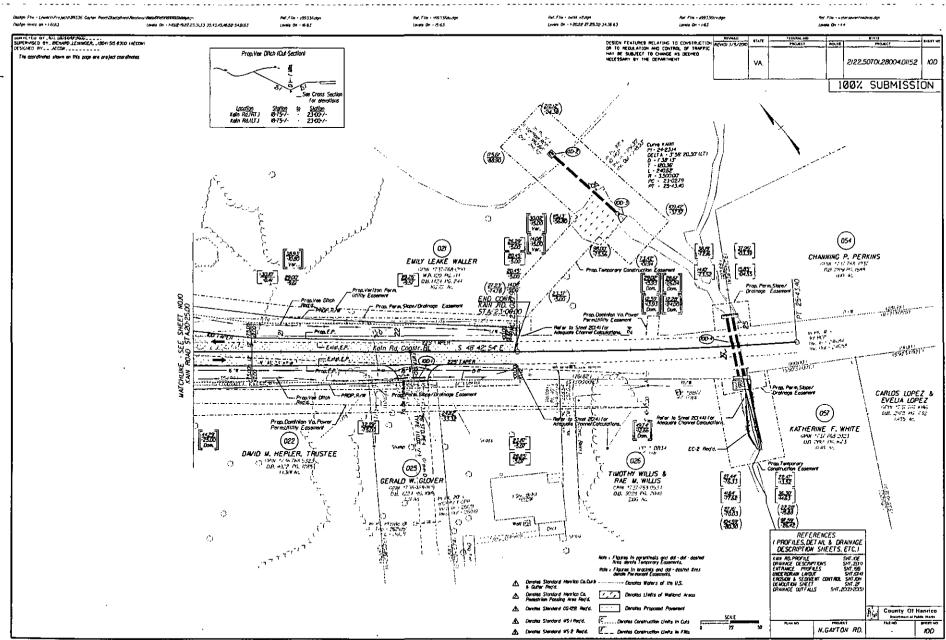

RESOLUTION — Award of Construction Contract — Broadwater Area (BWII) Phase I Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation — Varina District

This resolution awards the contract to G. L. Howard, Inc. in the amount of \$4,939,468 for replacement of approximately five miles of 4-, 6-, and 8-inch diameter gravity sewer by the open cut method, rehabilitation of approximately four miles of 8-inch diameter gravity sewer by the cured-in-place lining method, replacement of approximately 35 manholes, and rehabilitation of approximately 92 manholes.

The project is located in the Highland Springs area bordered by E. Nine Mile Road to the west, N. Airport Drive to the south, E. Washington Street to the east, and N. Ivy Ave. to the north, all in the Varina District. The purpose of the project is to replace deteriorated sewer piping installed from 1940 to the early 1970s to provide adequate capacity for peak wet weather flows and to minimize sanitary sewer overflows.

Work is anticipated to begin in August 2010 and is anticipated to be completed by December 2011. Funding to support the contract is available from federal Recovery Zone Economic Development bond proceeds within the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund.

Two bids were received on May 20, 2010 in response to Bid Request No.10-8813-3CE, and Addenda Nos.1 and 2, for the Broadwater Area (BWII) Phase I Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project.

RESOLUTION — Award of Construction Contract — Westoe Road and Swinton Lane Water Main Replacement

This Board Paper awards a construction contract to Possie B. Chenault, Inc. in the amount of \$345,146 to replace approximately 3,400 linear feet of 4-inch and 6-inch waterline with 6-inch ductile iron water main. The water main is located along Westoe Road, Highfield Road, Norwick Road and Swinton Lane in the Tuckahoe District. The work also includes abandonment of approximately 1,200 linear feet of 3-inch cast iron water main located within an easement.

The purpose of the project is to improve the reliability of the drinking water system by replacing a 4-inch unlined transite waterline installed in 1958 in Westoe Road, Highfield Road and Norwick Road and a 6-inch cast iron waterline installed in 1974 in Swinton Lane. These pipes are deteriorated and experience frequent breaks. The 3-inch waterline to be abandoned is undersized and has meters and services in the rear yards.

The work will begin in July 2010 and will be completed by February 2011. Funding to support the contract is available within the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund.
