Mr. Tracy advised the Board that settlement with the property owner had occurred after filing of the advertisement for this public hearing so staff was requesting withdrawal of the resolution.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board withdrew this item – see attached resolution.

Resolution - Signatory Authority - Modification of Contract for Public Transit Service in Henrico County - Greater Richmond Transit Company.

Tim Foster, Director of Public Works, recognized the following persons who were assisting him with the presentation for this public hearing: John Lewis, Chief Executive Officer of GRTC Transit System; Larry Hagan, Planning Director for GRTC Transit System; Todd Eure, Transportation Development Engineer for the County's Department of Public Works; and Chris Winstead, Assistant Director of Public Works for the County. Mr. Foster narrated a slide presentation on the Henrico County Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Mass Transit His presentation addressed the County's FY 11 mass transit operating budget, GRTC's current local and express routes serving the County, GRTC's average monthly ridership in the County from FY 05 - FY 10, cost reduction recommendations and the total estimated annual cost savings from these recommendations, and a proposed GRTC fare increase. advised that the proposed changes in service routes would be implemented in August 2010 if approved by the Board, GRTC would be continuing systemwide efforts to reduce costs and improve efficiencies, and the County would continue to work with GRTC to monitor all routes and recommend adjustments to schedules and routes if necessary. He noted that staff had received 39 emails and telephone calls from the public during the past week expressing concerns and feedback on the recommendations. The majority of the concerns focused on the recommendation to eliminate the Route 25 service, the Express During Mr. Foster's presentation, he responded to several questions from the Board pertaining to ridership statistics for this midday route. presentation, he and Mr. Lewis responded to a series of questions from the Board relating to ridership statistics and subsidies for routes recommended for elimination or reductions, alternatives for publicizing transit system routes, sources of funding for GRTC service, future trends in public transportation, GRTC's proposed fare increase, and local government participation in GRTC.

Mr. Hazelett announced that the following citizens who were not present for the public hearing had submitted written comments in advance and had specifically requested that these comments be made a part of the public record for the hearing: Deborrah Mahone, Tonya Morgan, and Jo Freeman. The following citizens who were registered to speak during the public hearing then addressed the Board:

- Martin J. Hubbell, a resident of 8909 Michaux Lane in the Tuckahoe District, read and submitted prepared remarks expressing concerns about the proposed cutbacks to the Route 26 service (Parham Park & Ride) and proposed elimination of the Route 25 service (Glenside/Parham/Gaskins Express). He presented a petition signed by concerned citizens and riders of the Route 26 service requesting the prevention of any cutbacks to the schedule for this service.
- Samuel Henderson, Jr., a resident of 6712 Cluck Lane in the Varina District, voiced concerns about proposed reductions to the Route 28 service (Fair Oaks Connector).
- Philip Underwood, a resident of 10324 in the Brookland District, stated concerns about the proposed elimination of the Route 25 service.
- Nicholas DiFilippis, a resident of 1913 Leslie Lane in the Fairfield
  District and representing the newly organized Richmond Transit
  Riders Union, asked the Board to expand transit services in the
  County, increase funding for these services, and make these services
  more affordable and reliable.

The following citizens who were not registered to speak during the public hearing also addressed the Board:

- Chris Lewis, a Henrico resident and employee of the Virginia Rehabilitation Center for the Blind and Vision Impaired, expressed concerns regarding the existing weekday schedule for Route 93 (Laburnum Connector) service and the absence of weekend service. Three students at the Center – Lillian Foster, Glenda King, and Wendy Thomas – voiced similar concerns and also asked that current service on this route not be reduced.
- Marianne Jorgenson, a resident of the Brookland District, expressed concerns that GRTC is not making maximum use of its buses.
- Heather Marshall Stout, a resident of the Tuckahoe District employed by Virginia Commmonwealth University Health System, questioned the methodology used to calculate ridership data for Route 25 service and suggested that GRTC use smaller buses.
- Siva Lavu, a resident of the Three Chopt District employed by the Federal Reserve Bank, voiced concern about the proposed elimination of Route 25 service.

- Thomas Kensay, a resident of the Three Chopt District and a state employee, commented favorably on GRTC service and expressed concern about the proposed elimination of Route 25 service and reduction of Route 29 service (Gaskins Express).
- Pamela Hinton, a resident of the Varina District and a state employee, suggested moving the Park and Ride lot for Route 28 service from its current location at the Flea Market to White Oak Village. She responded to a question from Mr. Thornton about conditions at the Flea Market.
- Karen Cullen, a resident of the Tuckahoe District and an employee of the Virginia Department of Social Services, stated that she would be happy to pay a greater amount for Route 25 service.
- Sara Snelson, a resident of the Tuckahoe District and a state employee, conveyed concerns relating to the proposed reduction of Route 26 service and proposed elimination of Route 25 service.
- John Snelson, a resident of the Tuckahoe District, commended the Board for subsidizing public transportation and asked the Board to postpone a vote on this resolution until a new ridership survey of Henrico citizens benefiting from GRTC service and the Park and Ride lots could be conducted.
- Rob Monroe, a resident of Fireside Drive in the Brookland District, spoke to the convenience of the Gaskins Park and Ride lot and the money saved by the County by having citizens ride the express buses and not having cars on the road.

Mr. Foster responded at length to questions and concerns raised by the speakers during the public hearing and to further questions from the Board. Mr. Hazelett and Mr. Lewis also responded and commented. Mr. Glover and Mr. Hazelett reminded the public of the \$732,000 shortfall facing the County should the adjustments in service recommended by staff not be made. Thornton commented that he understood the economics of the proposed reductions and eliminations in service but suggested that in the future the Board would need to look beyond funding and be more visionary while GRTC could do more public relations and education. There was further discussion by the Board and Mr. Foster regarding the County's transit funding shortfall, the process for making future route adjustments, and the cost savings that would be realized by using smaller buses.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

The Board recessed at 10:18 p.m. and reconvened at 10:30 p.m.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Vickie Beaty, a resident of the Three Chopt District, reiterated concerns she previously presented to the Board pertaining to commercial construction activities at Ridge Shopping Center on the site of a former Hardee's restaurant, including the length of a newly reinstalled fence screening the site from her property and the removal of trees along a creek embankment adjoining her rear property line. She responded to questions from the Board. In response to questions and comments from Mr. Glover, Mr. Hazelett advised the Board that County staff has been talking with the contractor and owner about the possibility of extending the fence further. He assured the Board that the County has tried to help Ms. Beaty every way it can while also pointing out to the Board that the developer is not legally obligated to extend the fence and that the items of concern to Ms. Beaty are not on her property. There was more discussion among Mr. Glover, Ms. Beaty, Mr. Kaechele, and Mr. Hazelett relating to Ms. Beaty's concerns and the County's efforts to assist her.

The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a special meeting on Tuesday, June 22, 2010 at 5:30 p.m. in the County Manager's Conference Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico, Virginia.

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 4:51 p.m.

## Virginia Retirement System (VRS) Modifications Pursuant to 2010 State Legislation

Mr. Hazelett recognized George Cauble, Jr., Director of Human Resources, who narrated a brief *Virginia Retirement System Review* slide presentation. Mr. Cauble advised the Board that due to changes to the Virginia Retirement System approved by the Virginia General Assembly during the 2010 Session, localities and school divisions opting to pay the five percent member contribution for Plan 2 members, i.e. those employees hired after July 1, 2010, would be required to pass a resolution prior to July 1, 2010. He noted that the Henrico School Board would be considering a resolution to pay the five percent employee contribution for Plan 2 members at its June 24, 2010 meeting. Mr. Cauble further noted that Henrico County began paying the five percent member contribution for its employees in FY 1977-78 in lieu of a salary increase. Mr. Hazelett elaborated on the distinction between VRS Plan 1 and Plan 2 members pursuant to the new state legislation

and clarified that Plan 1 members will not see a change in their retirement benefits. Mr. Cauble summarized how benefits for Plan 2 members will differ from those for Plan 2 members. He pointed out that the new state legislation resulted from a Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) study.

Mr. Cauble, Mr. Hazelett, Mr. Rapisarda, and Management and Budget Division Director Gene Walter responded to questions and comments from the Board regarding the Board's two options for funding Plan 2 employee VRS contributions, whether the new state legislation will impact law enforcement officer or school employee supplemental retirement benefits, the national trend away from traditional defined benefit pension plans in favor of defined contribution retirement plans, and the level of the County's annual VRS contributions. There was discussion among the Board, Mr. Vithoulkas, and Mr. Hazelett pertaining to VRS contribution rates and investments.

## Pending Ordinance Amendments Resulting from 2010 State Legislation

Mr. Hazelett recognized Ms. Adams, who narrated a slide presentation on Henrico Code Amendments Resulting from 2010 General Assembly Legislation. Ms. Adams reviewed several bills approved during the Session that would require changes to the County Code and an additional bill that would allow a change to the Code as follows: House Bill (HB) 239/Senate Bill (SB) 90 - renames animal protection officers as animal protection police officers and provides these officers with full law-enforcement powers; HB 985/SB 90 – excludes from the taxable gross receipts of security brokers and dealers amounts paid to independent contractors as commissions on the sale or purchase of a security; HB 1301/SB 355 – clarifies that short-term rental property is a classification of merchants' capital rather than tangible personal property and permits localities to continue to impose the Business, Professional, Occupational, and License (BPOL) tax on persons engaged in the short-term rental business; HB 409/HB 713 - requires contractors to provide certain documentation prior to issuance of initial or renewal business licenses and requires a licensed or certified contractor to furnish his license or certification number; and HB 367 allows imposition of an additional \$35.00 service charge for the return of a check, draft, or order payable to a locality on which a stop-payment order has been placed by the payer in bad faith. Ms. Adams advised that staff was recommending that ordinances incorporating these changes be introduced at the July 13, 2010 Board of Supervisors meeting, advertised in the Richmond Times Dispatch on July 20 and 27, 2010, and scheduled for public hearing at the Board's August 10, 2010 meeting.

Ms. Adams, Animal Protection Supervisor Shawn Sears, Mr. Hazelett, and Mr. Cauble responded to questions from the Board pertaining to the legislation addressing animal control police officers. These questions concerned the training that would be required for animal protection police officers, the restriction of the legislation to Henrico County, and the powers of and pay grades for this new classification of police officers. Ms. Adams responded to questions from the Board relating to the legislation addressing security brokers and dealers. These questions were in regards to the revenue impact of this legislative change on the County and the legal distinction between brokers and dealers. Ms. Adams also responded to a question concerning the legislation addressing contractors, specifically whether certain contracting businesses are exempted from having to obtain from a business license.

The Board recessed for dinner at 5:31 p.m. and reconvened at 5:59 p.m.

Mr. Hazelett briefly reviewed the presentations, appointments, public hearings, and general agenda items listed on the evening's regular meeting agenda. He advised that a citizen had signed up in advance to address the Board during the public comment period on concerns relating to the local public access cable television channel and that this matter should be discussed by the Board at a future work session on either July 13 or 27, 2010. Mr. Hazelett, Mr. Rapisarda, and Mrs. McKinney responded to questions from the Board regarding the County's level of control over the local cable public access studio, the cable companies' responsibilities for this studio, and how programming is controlled on the public access station. Mr. Hazelett reviewed the format of the evening's public hearing on the proposed reduction to Greater Richmond Transit Company (GRTC) service and how citizen comments would be incorporated into the record. There was more discussion by the Board and Mr. Hazelett of the public access cable television channel matter and by Mr. Glover and Mr. Hazelett of comments on WRVA-AM radio by commentators Paul Barrett and Jimmy Bottoms that were critical of the County's cable television station, *Henrico Today* publication, and residential investment tax abatement program.

Mr. Hazelett briefed the Board on the current status of VRS and how other localities in the region and the Commonwealth of Virginia had been responding to the new 2010 state legislation discussed at the outset of this special meeting. He and Mr. Vithoulkas responded to several questions and comments from the Board pertaining to the state revenue situation and there was extended discussion by Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Glover, and Mr. Hazelett relating to the financial predicament of other Virginia localities. There was then discussion by the Board, Mr. Hazelett, and Mr. Vithoulkas of the Richmond Flying Squirrels baseball team, the County's financial outlook for the coming year, alternate forms of local government in Virginia, the office of Sheriff, the future of high speed rail in the Commonwealth, and the viability of Amtrak's Main Street station.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:52 p.m.

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 4:09 p.m. She recognized Ms. Shuler, who welcomed the Board of Supervisors to the meeting. Mrs. Shuler commented that the Economic Development Authority (EDA) Board of Directors had been very busy during the past 18 months recruiting a new Executive Director and developing a new strategic plan.

## **Draft Economic Development Strategic Plan**

Ms. Shuler recognized Mr. McLaren, who noted that his staff had distributed draft copies of the EDA strategic plan to the members of the Board of Supervisors and EDA Board at the outset of the meeting. Mr. McLaren narrated a slide presentation addressing why the plan had been developed; the process followed by EDA in drafting the plan; the mission statement included in the plan; an analysis of the County's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats as related to the EDA's economic development operations and program and to the County's current economic development climate; the plan's strategic goals and objectives; the strategic measures that the EDA will use to monitor progress and results; and the plan's implementation. The four goals established by the plan are as follows: 1) Market Henrico County as a desirable pro-business location; 2) expand and diversify the business tax base; 3) attract well-paying jobs; and 4) maintain and strengthen a pro-business environment that employs policies and procedures that make Henrico County a competitive business location. Mr. McLaren pointed out that the EDA was looking for feedback from the Board of Supervisors on the plan and hoped to approve the plan by June 30, 2010.

Mrs. O'Bannon thanked Mr. McLaren for the presentation and the EDA Board and staff for the many hours they put into developing the plan. Mr. McLaren, Mr. Hazelett, and Mr. Silber responded to a number of questions and comments from members of the Board of Supervisors regarding the EDA's and County's economic development efforts. Issues and topics discussed included the possible need for more competitive incentives, particularly in enterprise zones, to close future economic development projects; changes in the ways larger companies are obtaining information on communities in which they are interested in locating; whether the County should be more aggressively recruiting retail businesses; the status of local and regional business retention efforts; the role of the Greater Richmond Partnership in local economic development; the level of EDA involvement in reviewing the County's Comprehensive Plan, land use decisions, and zoning cases; and the EDA's current level of staffing. Mr. Thornton remarked that the new strategic plan is healthy and that the County will need to start being more visionary and looking at things differently, especially in its use of the media. Mr. Steele responded to a question from Mr. Donati pertaining to how the EDA will measure or assess its performance after the plan is implemented. In response to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Hazelett elaborated on the successful negotiations that occurred among the County, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and Qimonda's predecessor company (Siemens-Motorola) during the mid-1990s when White Oak Technology Park was initially developed. Mr. McLaren responded to questions relating to future plans for the use of the

facility formerly occupied by Qimonda. Mr. McLaren and Mr. Hazelett responded to questions concerning the current status of the Governor's Opportunity Fund.

Ms. Shuler thanked everyone for attending the joint work session and announced that the EDA Board would be reconvening for its business meeting after taking a recess at the conclusion of this meeting.

There being no further business, this meeting was adjourned at 5:29 p.m.



# RESOLUTION — Condemnation — Rights-of-Way and Easements — North Gayton Road Extension Project — Centex Homes — Three Chopt District

This Board paper authorizes condemnation proceedings for property owned by Centex Homes, a Nevada general partnership, that is needed for the construction of the North Gayton Road Extension Project.

The County needs to acquire rights-of-way containing 452 sq. ft., permanent slope and drainage easements containing 24,722 sq. ft., a temporary construction easement containing 3,378 sq. ft., permanent easements for Virginia Electric and Power Company, a Virginia public service corporation, doing business as Dominion Virginia Power, containing 16,484.35 sq. ft., and permanent easements containing 7,034.18 sq. ft. for Verizon Virginia Inc., a Virginia corporation, (collectively, the "Rights-of-Way and Easements") across seven parcels of real property owned by Centex Homes and identified as Tax Map Parcels 470-769-0088, 740-770-2208, 740-769-4285, 740-769-6282, 740-769-7087, 740-769-8296, and 739-770-7715. Based on independent appraisals, bona fide offers totaling \$93,646 were made to and rejected by the owner.

This Board paper directs the County Manager to take the necessary steps to acquire the Rights-of-Way and Easements with the right to enter the property upon the filing of a certificate of take and the deposit of \$93,646 in the Clerk's Office of the Henrico County Circuit Court.

The Directors of Public Works and Real Property recommend approval of this Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

- (3) The County Manager shall send by certified mail a notice dated July 14, 2010, advising the Owner that the County intends to enter upon and take the Right-of-Way and Easements prior to the conclusion of condemnation proceedings, setting forth the compensation and damages offered by the County, and informing the Owner of the 30 days within which to contest the taking;
- (4) The Board finds a necessity exists to institute condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Code to acquire the Right-of-Way and Easements for the public use of constructing, operating, and maintaining the Project and to determine the amount of compensation and damages, if any, caused by the taking, possession and acquisition of the Right-of-Way and Easements;
- (5) After the 30-day period for the Owner to contest the taking has run, the County Attorney shall file in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court a certificate signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the Board in accordance with the Code and shall deposit with the Clerk the amount of the bona fide offer listed below that has not been accepted by the Owner:

and,

(6) The Board authorizes and directs the County Manager to continue to seek a voluntary acquisition of the Right-of-Way and Easements, to take all steps necessary to acquire the Right-of-Way and Easements, and to enter on and take immediate possession of the required Right-of-Way and Easements.

Comments: The Real Property Department has been unsuccessful in negotiating a settlement for the acquisition of the Right-of-Way and Easements. Therefore, the Directors of Public Works and Real Property recommend approval of this Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.





BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

1. That Section 20-312 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 20-312. Levy; amount.

Pursuant to Code of Virginia, § 58.1-3510.6A, as amended, for each tax year, there is hereby levied and imposed a tax of one percent on the gross proceeds arising from rentals of every person engaged in the short-term rental business. Such tax shall be in addition to the tax levied pursuant to Code of Virginia, § 58.1-605, as amended. "Gross proceeds" means the total amount charged to each person for the rental of short-term rental property, excluding any state and local sales tax paid under the provisions of Code of Virginia, Title 58.1, Chapter 6. The imposition and collection of a short-term rental property tax under this article with respect to rental property shall be in lieu of taxation of such rental property as tangible business personal property in the same tax year.

2. That Section 20-313 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 20-313. Taxation of rental property other than daily <u>short-term</u> rental property.

Except for daily rental vehicles <u>pursuant to Code of Virginia</u>, § 58.1-3510 and short-term rental property, rental property shall be classified, assessed and taxed as tangible personal property. if such property (i) is owned and rented by a person not engaged in the short-term rental business, as defined in § 20-311; or (ii) has acquired situs in the Commonwealth and is owned and rented by a person-who does not collect and remit to a locality within the Commonwealth a short-term rental property tax with respect to the rental of such property.

Every person engaged in the business of a retail merchant shall obtain a license for the privilege of doing business in the county and shall pay a license tax therefor. The term "retail merchant," as used in this division, shall include every merchant who sells to others at retail only and not for resale. The term "retail merchant," as used in this division, shall also include any person engaged in the short-term rental business as defined in § 20-311.

4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage as provided by law.

ORDINANCE - To Amend and Reordain Sections 4-112 and 4-113 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Application" and "Annual Permit," Respectively, Relating to Applications for a Music Festival Permit

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Sections 4-112 and 4-113 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Application" and "Annual Permit," respectively, relating to applications for a music festival permit.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 4-112 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 4-112. Application.

Application for a special entertainment permit required by this division shall be in writing on forms provided for the purpose and filed in duplicate with the director of public safety at least 45 days before the date of such festival. Such application shall have attached thereto and made a part thereof the plans, statements, approvals and other documents required by this division. A nonrefundable fee of \$200.00 shall accompany each application. The director of public safety may, at his discretion and upon an applicant's showing of good cause, consider an application submitted less than 45 days before the date of the festival.

2. That Section 4-113 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 4-113. Annual permit.

- (a) Eligibility. The director of public safety may issue an annual permit under this division for multiple festivals at a site which is the subject of an approved plan of development, has a structure previously used for outdoor concerts, and has previously satisfied the requirements of this article.
- (b) Application; fee. Application for an annual permit shall be in writing on forms provided for the purpose and filed in duplicate with the director of public safety at least 45 days before the date of the first festival to be held under the permit. The director of public safety may, at his discretion and upon an applicant's showing of good cause, consider an application submitted less

- than 45 days before the date of the festival. Except as provided in this subsection, the application shall have attached thereto and made a part thereof the plans, statements, approvals and other documents required by this division. An application for an annual permit need not contain the information described in section 4-115(a)(1) and (2), provided such information is submitted to the chief of police at least 15 days prior to each festival or as soon thereafter as such information becomes available. If such information is not submitted, the annual permit shall be null and void as to that particular festival. A nonrefundable fee of \$2,000.00 shall accompany each application for an annual permit.
- (c) Duration. Annual permits shall be issued for the period January 1 to December 31 of the same calendar year, except that, when the application is filed after January 1, the permit shall be effective from the date issued until December 31 of that same year.
- 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 2-51 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 2-51. Bonds.

. . .

- (c) Other persons. Persons holding the following positions shall give bond with corporate surety in the amount of \$100,000.00, payable to the county, conditioned on the faithful discharge of their duties and the proper account for all funds coming into their possession:
  - (1) The county manager and all deputy county managers;
  - (2) The director of general services;
  - (3) All employees of the department of social services duly authorized to certify payments to be made or authorized to draw warrants;
  - (4) The chief of police and all police officers, animal protection <u>police</u> officers, police aides, crossing guards, property technicians and identification technicians;
  - (5) The chief of fire, fire marshal and all deputy fire marshals;
  - (6) The supervisor of licenses and all deputies of that position; and
  - (7) The registrar.

. .

2. That Section 5-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-1. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

. . .

Vicious dog means a canine or canine crossbreed which has (i) killed a person; (ii) inflicted serious injury to a person, including multiple bites, serious disfigurement, serious impairment of health, or serious impairment of a bodily function; or (iii) continued to exhibit the behavior which resulted in a previous finding by a court or, on or before July 1, 2006, by an animal protection **police** officer that it is a dangerous dog, provided that its owner has been given notice of that finding.

3. That Section 5-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 5-2. Appointment of animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor; powers and duties generally.

An animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor shall be appointed by the county manager. The animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor shall have all the powers and duties of an animal warden <u>provided for in Code of Virginia</u>, title 3.2, ch. 65 (Code of <u>Virginia § 3.2-6500 et seq.</u>) in the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and the animal laws of the county and state and such other duties as may be prescribed by this Code, the Code of Virginia, or other ordinances or laws of the county or State.

4. That Section 5-3 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-3. Animal protection police officers.

The county manager shall appoint as many animal protection **police** officers as may be necessary in the enforcement of this chapter. Animal protection **police** officers shall have all the powers and duties of the animal protection **police officer** supervisor.

5. That Section 5-4 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-4. Disposal of dead animals.

The owner of any companion animal which has died from disease or other cause shall forthwith cremate, bury or sanitarily dispose of the animal. If, after notice, any owner fails to do so, the animal protection **police officer** supervisor or other officer shall bury or cremate the companion animal, and he may recover on behalf of the county from the owner his cost for this service. It shall be unlawful for any owner to fail to dispose of the body of his companion animal in violation of this section. Violation of this section shall be punishable as a class 4 misdemeanor.

6. That Section 5-31 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-31. Dogs killing or injuring livestock or poultry.

It shall be the duty of the animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor or other officer who may find a dog in the act of killing or injuring livestock or poultry to kill such dog forthwith whether such dog bears a tag or not. Any person finding a dog committing any of the depredations mentioned in this section shall have the right to kill such dog on

sight, as shall any owner of livestock or his agent finding a dog chasing livestock on land utilized by the livestock when the circumstances show that such chasing is harmful to the livestock. Any court shall have the power to order the animal protection police officer or other officer to kill any dog known to be a confirmed livestock or poultry killer, and any dog killing poultry for the third time shall be considered a confirmed poultry killer. The court, through its contempt powers, may compel the owner, custodian or harborer of the dog to produce the dog. If the animal protection police officer supervisor has reason to believe that a dog is killing livestock or poultry, he is empowered to seize such dog solely for the purpose of examining such dog in order to determine whether it committed any of the depredations mentioned in this section. The animal protection police officer supervisor or any other person who has reason to believe that any dog is killing livestock or committing any of the depredations mentioned in this section shall apply to any magistrate of the county, who shall issue a warrant requiring the owner or custodian, if known, to appear before the county general district court at a time and place named therein, at which time evidence shall be heard. If it shall appear that such a dog is a livestock killer or has committed any of the depredations mentioned in this section, the district court shall order that the dog be killed immediately by the animal protection police officer supervisor or other officer designated by the court, or removed to another state which does not border on this state and prohibited from returning to this state.

7. That Section 5-32 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 5-32. Compensation for livestock and poultry killed by dogs; false claims.

(a) Any person who has any livestock or poultry killed or injured by any dog not his own shall be entitled to receive as compensation the fair market value of such livestock or poultry, not to exceed \$400.00 per animal or \$10.00 per fowl; provided that the claimant has furnished evidence within 60 days of discovery of the quantity and value of the dead or injured livestock and the reasons the claimant believes that the death or injury was caused by dogs and the animal protection **police officer** supervisor has conducted an investigation and his investigation supports the claim.

8. That Section 5-36 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-36. Control of dangerous or vicious dogs.

(a) Any law enforcement officer or animal protection <u>police</u> officer who has reason to believe that a canine or canine crossbreed is a dangerous or vicious dog, shall apply to a county magistrate for the issuance of a summons requiring the owner or custodian, if known, to appear before the general district court at a specified time. The

summons shall advise the owner of the nature of the proceeding and the matters at issue. If a law enforcement officer successfully makes an application for the issuance of a summons, he shall contact an animal protection police officer and inform him of the location of the dog and the relevant facts pertaining to his belief that the dog is dangerous or vicious. The animal protection police officer shall confine the animal until a verdict is rendered on the summons. If the animal protection police officer determines that the owner or custodian can confine the animal in a manner that protects public safety, he may permit the owner or custodian to confine the animal until such time as evidence shall be heard and a verdict rendered. The court, through its contempt powers, may compel the owner, custodian or harborer of the animal to produce the animal. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a dangerous dog, the court shall order the animal's owner to comply with the provisions of this section. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a vicious dog, the court shall order the animal euthanized in accordance with section 5-142. The procedure for appeal and trial shall be the same as provided by law for misdemeanors. Trial by jury shall be as provided in Article 4 of Chapter 15 of Title 19.2 of the Code of Virginia. The Commonwealth shall be required to prove its case beyond a reasonable doubt.

. .

(d) Within ten days of a finding that an animal is a dangerous dog, the owner of the animal shall obtain a dangerous dog registration certificate from the animal protection unit of the division of police or the director of finance for a fee of \$50. This fee is in addition to other fees required by this chapter. The animal protection **police** officer or the director of finance shall provide the owner with a tag which identifies the animal as a dangerous dog. The owner shall affix the tag to the animal's collar and ensure that the animal wears the collar and tag at all times. All certificates obtained pursuant to this subsection shall be renewed annually for the same fee and in the same manner as the initial certificate was obtained. The animal protection **police** officer shall provide a copy of the dangerous dog registration certificate and verification of compliance to the State Veterinarian.

. .

9. That Section 5-53 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-53. Failure to pay tax.

(a) Any person convicted of failure to pay the dog license tax prior to February 1 of any year, or as otherwise provided in this division, on any dog owned by him shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor. Such person shall be required to obtain the proper license forthwith. Unless the fine and license tax are paid immediately, the court shall order the proper disposition of such dog by the animal protection **police officer** 

supervisor or some other officer, but the disposition of such dog shall not relieve its owner of the payment of the fine and the license tax already due.

. . .

10. That Section 5-59 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-59. Display of receipt; wearing of collar and tag.

- (a) Dog license receipts shall be carefully preserved by the licensees and exhibited promptly on request for inspection by any animal protection **police** officer or other law enforcement officer. Dog license tags shall be securely fastened to a substantial collar by the owner or custodian and worn by such dog. It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any licensed dog, four months of age or over, to be off the premises of the owner at any time without wearing the license tag; except that the owner of the dog may remove the collar and license tag required by this section when the dog:
  - (1) Is engaged in lawful hunting;
  - (2) Is competing in a dog show;
  - (3) Has a skin condition which would be exacerbated by the wearing of a collar;
  - (4) Is confined; or
  - (5) Is under the immediate control of the owner.

. . .

11. That Section 5-61 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-61. Display of kennel tags; allowing dogs out of kennel.

(a) The owner of a kennel in the county shall securely fasten the license tag to the kennel enclosure in full view and keep one of the identification plates provided therewith attached to the collar of each dog authorized to be kept enclosed in the kennel. Any identification plates not so in use must be kept by the owner or custodian and promptly shown to the animal protection **police officer** supervisor or other officer upon request. A kennel dog shall not be permitted to stray beyond the limits of the enclosure, but this shall not prohibit removing dogs therefrom temporarily while under the control of the owner or custodian for the purpose of exercising, hunting, breeding, trial or show. The animal protection **police officer** supervisor may, in his discretion,

issue a permit allowing kennel dogs to run at large during such months as he may deem proper; provided that such permit shall not authorize such dogs to run at large contrary to any other provisions of this Code or other ordinance of the county. Every permit shall state the months that such dogs may run at large and the rules and regulations that must be complied with, and the animal protection **police officer** supervisor may revoke any such permit at any time. Forms of application blanks and permits shall be supplied by the animal protection **police officer** supervisor. A kennel shall not be operated in such a manner as to defraud the county of the license tax applying to dogs which cannot be legally covered thereunder or to in any manner violate other provisions of this chapter.

. . .

12. That Section 5-81 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

### Sec. 5-81. Required; certificate.

. .

(d) The certificate issued pursuant to subsection (b) of this section shall be preserved by the owner of the dog or cat and exhibited promptly on request for inspection by any animal protection **police** officer or other law enforcement officer.

. .

13. That Section 5-102 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

### Sec. 5-102. Sterilization required.

. .

(e) Order to comply. Upon the petition of the animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor, an investigator or the state veterinarian or his designee to the district court where a violation of this division occurs, the court may order the new owner to take any steps necessary to comply with the requirements of this division. This remedy shall be exclusive of and in addition to any civil penalty which may be imposed under this division.

. . .

14. That Section 5-133 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-133. Impoundment generally; holding period.

- (a) The animal protection <u>police officer</u> supervisor or other officer who finds a dog without the tags required by this chapter, or a dog running at large in violation of section 5-34(7), or any other animal in violation of the provisions of this chapter shall impound such animal in the pound.
- 15. That Section 5-136 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-136. Redemption of animals.

Either a custodian of an animal or an individual who has found an animal may qualify as owner and may claim the animal by expressing his desire in writing to claim the animal at the expiration of the period set out in section 5-133(a) after payment of required fees. The rightful owner may redeem any animal confined pursuant to this article by producing an authorized current valid vaccination certificate, if required by this chapter, and a current dog license receipt or tag, if required by this chapter, and by paying to the animal protection **police officer** supervisor the board and redemption fees set out in section 5-143. Payment of the charges provided for in this section shall not relieve any person from prosecution for a violation of this chapter.

16. That Section 5-140 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

# Sec. 5-140. Voluntary delivery of animal by owner; surrender of owner's rights in animal.

Nothing in this article shall prohibit the immediate euthanasia or disposal by the methods listed in subdivisions (1) through (5) of section 5-137 of an animal that has been released to the pound or animal protection **police officer** supervisor by the animal's rightful owner after the rightful owner has read and signed a statement (i) surrendering all property rights in such animal, (ii) certifying that no other person has a right of property in the animal, and (iii) acknowledging that the animal may be immediately euthanized or disposed of in accordance with subdivisions (1) through (5) of section 5-137.

17. That Section 5-141 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-141. Seizure and impoundment of stolen or unlawfully held dogs or cats.

The animal protection **police officer** supervisor or other officer finding a stolen dog or cat or a dog or cat held or detained contrary to the law shall have the authority to seize and hold such animal pending court action. If no such action is instituted within seven days, the animal protection **police officer** supervisor or other officer shall deliver the animal to its owner. The presence of a dog or a cat on the premises of a person other than its legal owner shall raise no presumption of theft against the owner of the property, and the animal protection **police officer** supervisor may take such animal in charge and notify its legal owner to remove it. The legal owner shall pay to the animal protection **police officer** supervisor a fee in the amount of \$5.00 for each day that such animal has been confined

18. That Section 5-173 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 5-173. Confinement or destruction of dogs and cats suspected of having rabies.

- (a) Dogs or cats found within the county reasonably suspected of having rabies or exhibiting the common symptoms of such disease shall be taken into custody immediately by the animal protection **police** officer or any police officer and confined in the county pound or at a private veterinarian's establishment approved by the county health director in solitary confinement and kept under competent observation for such time as may be necessary to determine whether they are afflicted with rabies.
- (c) The animal protection <u>police</u> officer may cause to be destroyed humanely any dog or cat which, in the opinion of a veterinarian, has rabies, or any dog or cat which is in need of confinement pursuant to subsection (a) of this section but for which such confinement is impossible or impracticable because there apparently is no owner or for other reasons. In such event the animal protection <u>police</u> officer shall arrange to have the head of such dog or cat examined for the purpose of confirming rabies. If the opinion of a veterinarian as to whether an animal has rabies is not reasonably obtainable, the animal protection <u>police</u> officer may act on his own opinion.

. . .

. . .

19. That Section 5-174 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-174. Confinement or destruction of biting animals.

- (a) Upon information to the county division of police or any animal protection **police** officer that a dog or cat has bitten a person, it shall be the duty of the animal protection **police** officer, upon ascertaining the identity of such dog or cat, to direct it to be confined for a period of ten days from the date the bite occurred, such confinement to be either with a veterinarian approved by the county health director or in a kennel or enclosure approved by the animal protection **police** officer as the person who owns or controls such dog or cat shall select, provided that the person who owns or controls such dog or cat shall bear the cost of such confinement. It shall further be the duty of the animal protection **police** officer to assume the responsibility of supervising such confinement and ordering the dog or cat to be released if it is safe to do so at the end of the confinement period required by this subsection.
- (b) A wild, nondomestic or feral domestic animal biting or otherwise injuring a human being, and suspected of being rabid by the county health director or animal protection **police** officer, shall be humanely destroyed and its head sent to the state laboratory for evaluation.
- 20. That Section 5-175 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-175. Confinement or destruction of dogs or cats bitten by rabid animals.

Any dog or cat bitten by an animal believed to be afflicted with rabies shall be destroyed immediately and humanely or confined under strict quarantine, at the expense of the owner, in a kennel or enclosure approved by the animal protection **police** officer for a period not to exceed six months. If the owner of the bitten animal has proof of a valid rabies vaccination, the animal shall be revaccinated immediately by a licensed veterinarian at the expense of the owner and the period of confinement shall be 90 days. If the owner of the bitten animal does not have proof of a valid rabies vaccination, the animal shall be destroyed humanely immediately, or confined for six months. In the event of a six-month confinement, the dog or cat shall receive a rabies vaccination at the expense of the owner four weeks prior to release.

21. That Section 5-179 of the Code of the County of Henrico shall be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 5-179. Enforcement measures on noncompliance by owner of dog or cat.

If any person who owns or controls a dog or cat fails or refuses to comply with any of the provisions of this article or with any instructions given by an animal protection

**police** officer, a veterinarian, a health department representative or other appropriate official pursuant to this article, the animal protection **police** officer may take such dog or cat immediately into custody and confine it in the county pound. The person owning or controlling such dog or cat shall then be summoned immediately by the animal protection **police** officer to appear in the general district court, where the matter shall be heard as all other matters are heard on criminal warrants. Upon finding that such person either owns or controls a dog or cat and has failed or refused to comply with any provision of this article or with instructions properly given pursuant to this article, the judge, in addition to any sentence which he may impose for conviction of a class 4 misdemeanor, shall order any confinement or destruction of the animal appropriate under the circumstances and pursuant to this article, and shall order the convicted person to pay for any required vaccination, license and confinement-related expenses.

22. That this ordinance shall be in effect on and after its passage as provided by law.





On February 10, 2004, the Board approved criteria for the County's Traffic Calming Program.

The County's Traffic Engineer has collected traffic data and has determined that Snowmass Road between Nuckols Road and Village Run Drive and a portion of Alvarado Road between Michael Road and Anoka Road in the County are experiencing speeding problems and meet the criteria for traffic calming measures set forth in the Traffic Calming Program.

The citizens in the area of these roads requesting the increased fine have collected signatures from 75% of the residents on Snowmass Road and 85% of the residents on Alvarado Road.

The Board paper authorizes the County Manager to place appropriate signs on Snowmass Road between Nuckols Road and Village Run Drive, and a portion of Alvarado Road between Michael Road and Anoka Road warning of an additional fine of \$200 for speeding.


