#### PUBLIC HEARINGS - REZONING CASES AND PROVISIONAL USE PERMITS

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m.

Mrs. O'Bannon led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Elayne Hudson-Scott, Pastor of New Life Evangelistic Ministries International, delivered the invocation.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board approved the minutes of the July 27, 2010 Regular and Special Meetings.

#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Leo Marsh, Business Section Manager for the Department of Finance, recently received the prestigious designation of Personal Property Specialist (PPS) from the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO). In attaining this achievement, Mr. Marsh completed over 200 hours of in-depth coursework and passed both an eight-hour case study and four-hour cumulative master exam. He is only the 2nd person within the Commonwealth of Virginia and 25<sup>th</sup> in the entire United States to earn this designation. Mr. Marsh's supervisor, Revenue Division Director Ed Trice, presented a special plaque from IAAO to Mr. Marsh in the presence of John Vithoulkas, Director of Finance.

Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) is currently hosting 12 Turkish sub-governors (governors in training), who are participating in a professional development program in public policy and administration through the university's L. Douglas Wilder School of Government and Public Affairs and its Global Education Office. Prior to entering this program, the sub-governors completed seven months of study in VCU's English language program. In Turkey, these officials are responsible for education, health care administration, finance, public safety, social services, and "construction" (urban planning). Their summer program includes lectures, site visits, and rotating internships relating to their areas of oversight. Mr. Hazelett recently met with the entire group to discuss governance in Henrico County. He recognized the following members of the group who were in the audience observing the Board meeting: Oktay Ates, Sedat Attes, Hasan Gundogdu, Remzi Kattas, and Uhut Emre Koyunci. After noting that Mr. Kaechele was in Turkey last year, Mrs. O'Bannon joined Mr. Hazelett in thanking the group for coming to Henrico. Mr. Hazelett advised that the group will also be attending an upcoming pre-Board session with the County's department heads and key officials.

193-10 P-6-10 Three Chopt West Broad Village, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-32.1 (a) and (t), 24-120, and 24-122.1 of the County Code in order to allow a farmers' market, community/demonstration gardens and a production farm on part of Parcels 743-760-2155 and 744-760-7007, located on the south line of West Broad Street (U.S. Route 250) at its intersection with Brookriver Drive (West Broad Village).

Mr. Kaechele commented favorably on the case, noting that the proposed uses would be a nice addition to West Broad Village and would be well received by the citizens who live and shop there. Jean Moore, Assistant Director of Planning, responded to questions from the Board.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

Mark Kokowsky, a representative of the applicant, responded to additional questions from the Board.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to the following conditions:

#### Farmers' Market:

1. The operation of the Whole Foods Farmers' Market shall comply with the following standards and shall not operate outside of the following parameters:

Market Season: Beginning on the fourth Thursday of April and ending on the third Thursday in October.

<u>Hours of Operation:</u> Market hours are every Thursday during the Market Season, from 4:00 PM until 7:00 PM.

- 2. The applicant shall designate a Market Manager to be in charge of the farmers' market operations, including vendor selection, and responsible for compliance with the conditions of this Provisional Use Permit. The Market Manager shall be responsible for complying with all local, state, and federal regulations. Market operations shall abide by all rules and regulations set forth in Exhibit B (see case file) entitled "Whole Foods Market Vendor Information and Rules and Regulations," dated July 13, 2010.
- 3. The farmers' market shall be no greater than 2,500 square feet in size and shall be located only along the southern and eastern façades of the Whole Foods Market grocery store.
- 4. Other than temporary stands for vendors or the Market Manager, no structures or tents shall be erected on the property. All tents shall be solid in color, and neither text nor logo displays shall be permitted on any tent or similar temporary structure. No later than one hour after the closing of each market, any stands shall be removed from the site and the subject parcels shall be completely cleared of all market-related items and debris.
- 5. Only produce and those processed foods that are regulated by the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall be permitted for sale. Artisans are allowed to vend non-edible products. These vendors shall not exceed 25% of the total market area. Artisans must produce their own products. Food sampling shall be allowed in accordance with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services food safety regulations. Under no circumstances shall samples be sold.

- 6. Generators, portable toilets, or use of public address systems (including megaphones) shall not be permitted on the site.
- 7. No outside live music performances or outdoor speaker systems shall be permitted on the site. One musician with one non-electric, non-amplified, musical instrument and musical performances shall be permitted within the 2,500 square foot farmers' market area. To be consistent with other vendors, each musician must complete a vendor application and shall perform within the operating hours of the farmers' market. The music shall not be audible beyond the property line of the site.
- 8. The Director of Planning shall review the operation of the outdoor farmers' annually for a period of 36 months to ensure compliance with the conditions imposed with this Provisional Use Permit. If the Director finds, based upon his review, that the permit holder has failed to comply with any of the conditions or that the operation of the outdoor farmers' market or Village Garden is having a deleterious effect on the surrounding area, then the Director shall initiate a show cause hearing on revocation of the permit pursuant to the provisions of Section 24-122.1(b) of the County Code.

## Community/Demonstration Gardens and Production Farm:

9. The operator of the Whole Foods Village Garden shall comply with the following conditions:

<u>Use:</u> The Village Garden is for the specific use of: a demonstration garden, a community garden and a production farm and associated educational programming. No sales or vending is permitted, except that produce grown and harvested on the production farm component of the property may be sold to Whole Foods Market.

<u>Hours of Operation:</u> The Village Garden will be open from dusk to dawn.

- The community/demonstration gardens and production farm will be developed in substantial conformance with Exhibit D (see case file), entitled Whole Foods Garden, dated July 14, 2010.
- 11. All activities in the community/demonstration garden and production farm will be in compliance with the "Garden Layout and Design Proposal" (see case file) as submitted with this application.
- 12. The area of the community/demonstration gardens and production farm will be as shown on Exhibit D (see case file), and will encompass an

area approximately .86 acres. The gardens and production farm will not exceed the area shown on Exhibit D (see case file) unless written permission is obtained from the Director of Planning in advance of any changes to the area. A revised economic impact analysis for the West Broad Street Village project may be required prior to any authorized expansion of the community/demonstration gardens and production farm.

- 13. The gravel path providing access to the site will be rolled to provide a more stable walking surface.
- 14. No vehicles will be allowed on-site with the exception of a Backyard Farmer vehicle. All vehicles must park in one of the paved lots between the Whole Foods Market and the Village Garden.
- 15. A gate will be installed to prevent unauthorized access to the site. A fence, to secure the perimeter of the site, will also be installed around the entire Village Garden area.
- 16. Signage indicating the hours of operation should be posted to limit trespassing after hours.
- 17. The Provisional Use Permit for the Village Garden will be effective for a period of 24 months. After 24 months, the applicant shall apply to the Planning Commission for a reissuance of the PUP.

# Recommended Conditions Applicable to Farmers' Market and Village Garden:

- 18. On-site food preparation and distribution of prepared meals shall not be permitted.
- 19. The sale or consumption of alcohol shall be prohibited.
- 20. Trash receptacles shall be provided and properly serviced to control litter generated by this use. All refuse including produce, boxes, etc. shall be removed from the premises at the end of each sales day.
- 21. The operation of the farmers' market and Village Garden shall not cause loitering, criminal assaults or public nuisance or unsafe conditions for the surrounding area.
- 22. Prior to the installation of any structures or alterations to the farmers' market or Village Garden area, the Market Manager shall submit any necessary Plan of Development (POD) revisions to the Department of Planning for approval. The POD shall delineate the specific vendor areas and details of pedestrian walkways, drive aisles, and parking stalls for the site. The vendor area shall be secured to prevent unauthorized access

into the vendor area and to provide safe pedestrian access to and from the market.

194-10 C-10C-10 Fairfield Emerald Land Development LLC: Request to amend proffered conditions accepted with Rezoning Case C-59C-07, on Parcels 790-746-1573 and 790-746-1765 containing 1.56 acres located at the southeast intersection of North Road and Edgefield Street.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Donati, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to amended proffers 1 and 2 and added proffers 9 and 10 as follows:

- 9. Garages: Each new dwelling shall have a minimum of a one-car attached garage with interior dimensions free of as-built obstructions of at least 10 feet in width and at least 20 feet in depth. The garage shall not protrude beyond the front building line of the house.
- 10. Driveways: Each new dwelling shall have a hard surface driveway consisting of exposed aggregate, stone, or asphalt.

All other proffers previously accepted with C-59C-07 shall remain in full force and effect.

under Sections 24-58.2(a) and (d), 24-120, and 24-122.1 of the County Code in order to allow outside dining and extended hours of operation until 2 a.m. for an existing restaurant (Short Pump Pour House) in Short Pump Crossing Shopping Center, on part of Parcel 738-760-8449, located on the west line of

Pump Road approximately 600 feet north of its intersection with Three Chopt Road.

Ms. Moore responded to questions from the Board.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and denied the request for extended hours of operation and approved the request to operate an outdoor dining area subject to the following conditions:

- 1. No outdoor live music performances shall be permitted.
- 2. The operator shall not permit food preparation outside the enclosed building.
- 3. The outside dining area shall not be in operation between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- 4. Prior to operation of the outdoor dining area, the applicant shall submit a site plan of the restaurant and outdoor dining area and obtain administrative approval from the Planning Department. The site plan shall show the location of any relocated street furniture, trees/landscaping, lighting and utility lines.
- 5. A clear, continuous, and unobstructed pedestrian path not less than 5' in width shall be required for pedestrian circulation between the outdoor dining area and the sidewalk curb.
- 6. A method of enclosure to provide separation of the dining area from the parking area shall be installed and shall complement the building façade as well as any street furniture. The railings shall not exceed 42" in height and shall consist of commercial grade material for durability. Unless otherwise approved by the Director of Planning, the outdoor railing enclosure shall conform to Exhibit B (see case file), entitled "Proposed Railing."
- 7. Outdoor lighting fixtures shall complement the style of building. Lighting fixtures shall be from a concealed source and shall not produce glare for motorists or pedestrians on the adjacent rights-of-

way and parking areas and shall illuminate only the outdoor dining area.

- 8. Trash receptacles shall be provided and properly serviced to control litter generated by this use.
- 9. This permit shall apply only to the tenant space to be occupied by Short Pump Pour House restaurant and shall not apply to any other business in the overall shopping center.
- 10. Access to the outdoor dining area shall be available only through the interior of the restaurant, except during an emergency when a patio fence exit gate may be utilized.
- 11. Prior to operation, the applicant shall consult with the Special Services Unit within the Division of Police to discuss crime prevention recommendations and conduct a security survey of the property and restaurant operations. The applicant shall implement mutually agreed upon security recommendations.
- 12. Any outside speakers and/or sound system shall comply with the following standards:
  - a) Sound systems shall be equipped with controls that permit full and complete volume control; and
  - b) Sound(s) emitted from the system shall not be audible beyond a distance of one hundred (100) feet measured from the source.
- 13. Televisions and other video display devices shall be prohibited in the outdoor dining area.

The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a special meeting on Tuesday, August 10, 2010 at 5:00 p.m. in the County Manager's Conference Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico, Virginia.

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

Mr. Hazelett briefly reviewed the two items listed on the special meeting agenda and advised that he would be requesting the Board's consideration in adding a third item by unanimous consent later in the meeting.

#### Innsbrook Area Study and 2026 Comprehensive Plan Updates

Mr. Hazelett recognized Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, who narrated a slide presentation on the Innsbrook Area Land Use Study. Mr. Emerson noted that the purpose of his presentation was to highlight information that the Board received in a loose leaf binder prior to this meeting and to answer questions from the Board. He further noted that the Board initiated the study to recognize Innsbrook as an important economic generator, examine opportunities for infill development, respond to the influence of recent trends towards mixed-use development, and support the goals and objectives of the County's 2026 Comprehensive Plan. During his presentation, Mr. Emerson

reviewed the study's planning process and public input, aerial photos of the original study area and study area addition, existing conditions in Innbrook, mixed-use development previously approved in Innsbrook, development scenarios, four major land bays that have been identified, development form and guidelines, proposed land use, urban development areas, keystone policy topics, and a 2026 future land use map. He advised that the remaining steps were to revise documents per comments and direction from the Board; schedule a Board public hearing for September 14, 2010; and then move ahead with adoption by the Board. Mr. Emerson elaborated on how the public has been made aware of the study's proposals and pointed out that the Planning Commission and staff recommended that the Board amend the 2026 Comprehensive Plan to include Innsbrook as an Urban Development Area.

During his presentation, Mr. Emerson responded to questions from the Board pertaining to the acreage covered by the study and the types of residential development that could occur within each of the four development scenarios. Following Mr. Emerson's presentation, Mr. Kaechele commented favorably on Mr. Emerson's summary of the study and complimented the Planning Commission and Planning Department staff on the manner in which they presented the study to citizens. Mr. Kaechele remarked that the study's recommendations are important to the future of the County and have generally been well received by citizens although some citizens have concerns about how the proposed land use for Innsbrook will impact traffic and development densities. Mr. Emerson responded to further questions from the Board relating to the impact of the study's recommendations on schools, retail office development, building heights, parking, and adjoining residential neighborhoods. Mr. Glover commented favorably on the scenario that staff has come up with in the study and Mr. Thornton characterized staff's work on the study as visionary. Mr. Thornton also stated that it is important to let citizens know that the type of land use proposed in this study will be applied to all areas of the County. Mr. Hazelett concluded the discussions by confirming that a public hearing on the 2026 Comprehensive Plan amendments recommended by the study will be placed on the Board's September 14, 2010 regular meeting agenda.

#### **County Code Recodification**

Mr. Rapisarda commented briefly on the County's current Code recodification process, which began in March 2009 when the County contracted with Municipal Code Corporation (MCC) for editorial assistance and publication of the recodified Code. Mr. Hazelett then recognized Marissa Mitchell, Assistant County Attorney, who narrated a slide presentation on this item. Mrs. Mitchell explained that the purpose of recodification is to take a comprehensive look at County laws, update them, and make them easily accessible for all citizens and members of the County staff who must interpret and enforce the Code on a regular basis. The Code is reviewed to identify and eliminate conflicts, inconsistencies, and obsolete provisions per the Virginia Code; identify and eliminate obsolete, redundant, or conflicting provisions within the County Code; and identify and eliminate potentially unconstitutional provisions. During her presentation, Mrs. Mitchell also discussed the County's contract with MCC, the chapters of the County Code that were reviewed, various steps in the recodification process, and department contacts and attorneys involved in this process. Mrs. Mitchell advised that future action will include introducing the ordinance to adopt the recodified Code at the Board's September 14, 2010 regular meeting and

conducting a public hearing to adopt the ordinance at the Board's October 12, 2010 regular meeting. The proposed effective date of the 2010 recodified code is January 1, 2011.

At the conclusion of Mrs. Mitchell's presentation, Mr. Rapisarda offered kudos to Mrs. Mitchell, her project team in the County Attorney's Office, and County departments involved in the recodification process. Mr. Rapisarda and Mrs. Mitchell responded to questions from the Board regarding the anticipated volume of public comment that will be received on the recodification ordinance, examples of provisions in the Code that are being changed as a result of recodification, and the schedule for recodifying the Code of Virginia. Mr. Rapisarda pointed out that County citizens can access the Henrico County Code and new County ordinances on line via the MCC website. At Mr. Hazelett's request, Mr. Rapisarda elaborated on the Code amendment process.

The Board recessed for dinner at 6:01 p.m. and reconvened at 6:11 p.m.

Mr. Hazelett advised that he was requesting that the Board members sign a waiver to add a closed meeting item to the special meeting agenda concerning the Cobbs Creek Reservoir Project. He further advised that staff had drafted a resolution that could be added to the evening's general agenda by unanimous consent if the Board was in agreement after discussing this matter in closed session.

On motion by Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, the Board approved going into a Closed Meeting at 6:12 p.m. for the following purpose:

212-10 C-11C-10 Brookland Hallmark Home Builders, Inc.: Request to amend proffered conditions accepted with Rezoning Case C-66C-03 on Parcels 771-774-3218, -1888, -1883, -3818, -1877,-4418, -1871, -5017, -1765, -5617, -1858, -5837, -1853, -5137, -1747,-4537, -1840, -3937, -1735, -3337, -1729, -3449,-1723, -4049, -4648, -5248, -5847, -6067, -5366, -4765, -4165, -3565 located along the south line of Mill Road approximately 300 feet east of LaVecchia Way. The applicant proposes to amend Proffer 13 related to fence height and type. The existing zoning is R-5AC General Residence District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Suburban Residential 2, density not to exceed 3.4 units per acre. Acting on a motion by Mr. Vanarsdall seconded by Mr. Branin, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors grant the request because the changes do not greatly reduce the original intended purpose of the proffers.

213-10 C-14C-10 Brookland Ron Swinson: Request to conditionally rezone from R-2 One-Family District to R-2AC One-Family Residence Residence (Conditional), Parcels 766-762-5366 and 766-762-6067 containing .658 acres, located at the northeast intersection of Staples Mill Road (U.S. Route 33) and Attems Way. The applicant proposes to construct one additional dwelling unit. The use will be controlled by zoning ordinance regulations and proffered conditions. The Land Use Plan recommends Suburban Residential 1, density not to exceed 2.4 units per acre. Acting on a motion by Mr. Vanarsdall seconded by Mr. Branin, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors deny the request because it does not conform to the recommendation of the Land Use Plan and represents an increase in intensity which could influence future zoning and development of nearby properties.

214-10 C-13C-10 Fairfield Brook Run Somerset LLC: Request to amend proffered conditions accepted with rezoning case C-33C-04 on Parcels 784-749-1627 and 784-748-0982, located on the west line of Brook Road (U.S. Route 1), approximately 875 feet south of its intersection with Hilliard Road (State Route 161). The applicant proposes to amend Proffer 2 related to age restrictions and Proffer 3 related to enforcement of age restrictions. The existing zoning is R-5C General Residence District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Multi-Family Residential and Environmental Protection Area. The site is in the Enterprise Zone. Acting on a motion by Mr. Archer seconded by Mrs. Jones, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors deny the request because the applicant failed to meet his burden to show that the requested changes are in the best interests of the welfare and future of the community. (Withdrawn by applicant.)

215-10 P-7-10 Three Chopt Albert Diradour: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(d), 24-120, and 24-122.1 of the County Code in order to allow outside dining for an existing restaurant in Westpark Shopping Center, on Parcel 754-758-6408, located at the southwest intersection of W. Broad Street (U.S. Route 250) and Pemberton Road (State Route 157). The existing zoning is B-2C Business District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Commercial Arterial. Acting on a motion by Mr. Branin seconded by Mrs. Jones the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors grant the request because the conditions should minimize the potential impacts on surrounding land uses and it would not be expected to adversely affect public safety, health or general welfare.

216-10 P-9-10 Fairfield Clearwire US LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-95(a)(3), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to retain one (1) microwave dish, replace one (1) microwave dish, and add two (2) new microwave dishes to an existing communications tower, on part of Parcel 784-758-8385, located approximately 575 feet east of the intersection of Mountain and Telegraph Roads. The existing zoning is M-1C Light Industrial District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Planned Industry. This site is in the Enterprise Zone. Acting on a motion by Mr. Archer seconded by Mr. Branin, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 (one abstention) to recommend the Board of Supervisors grant the request because it would not be expected to adversely affect public safety, health or general welfare, and it would provide added services to the community.

# RESOLUTION — Approval of Amendments to 2026 Comprehensive Plan — Innsbrook Area Study

This Board paper would approve amendments to the 2026 Comprehensive Plan (the "Plan") to adopt the recommendations of the Innsbrook Area Study.

The study area consists of the Innsbrook Corporate Center and areas generally bounded by West Broad Street, Interstate 64, Gaskins Road, and areas west of Sadler Road, east of Interstate 295 and south of Dublin Road. It contains a variety of future land use designations in the 2026 Comprehensive Plan.

Innsbrook has the potential to be redeveloped with a mixture of uses that take advantage of existing infrastructure and population base in the area. The Board has directed the Planning Department to conduct a study of the appropriate uses and possible future development of the Innsbrook area.

The Innsbrook Area Study recommends the Plan and Future Land Use Map be amended to include new goals, objectives, and policies to facilitate higher density development compatible with existing uses and to re-designate the future land use classifications from Office, Commercial Arterial, Commercial Concentration, Suburban Residential 2, and Urban Residential to Urban Mixed-Use and Traditional Neighborhood Development.

The findings of the study were presented to the public at two informational meetings held in the study area. In addition to the public information meetings, the Planning Commission held several work sessions to discuss the study. The Commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendments to the Plan on July 15, 2010. At that meeting, the Commission recommended the Board of Supervisors approve amendments to the Plan.

The Planning Commission recommendation was based on the June 17, 2010 version of the study. Subsequent to this action, minor housekeeping modifications were made to the study and the July 23, 2010 version was distributed to the Board of Supervisors with information from the public information meetings and draft minutes of the Planning Commission's public hearing. The Board of Supervisors held a work session on August 10, 2010.

These amendments would adopt the vision, goals, objectives, policies and future land use classifications contained in the Innsbrook Area Study, as revised on July 23, 2010. They would also amend the Plan to designate the Innsbrook area as an Urban Development Area consistent with Code of Virginia.

The Director of Planning recommends approval, and the County Manager concurs.

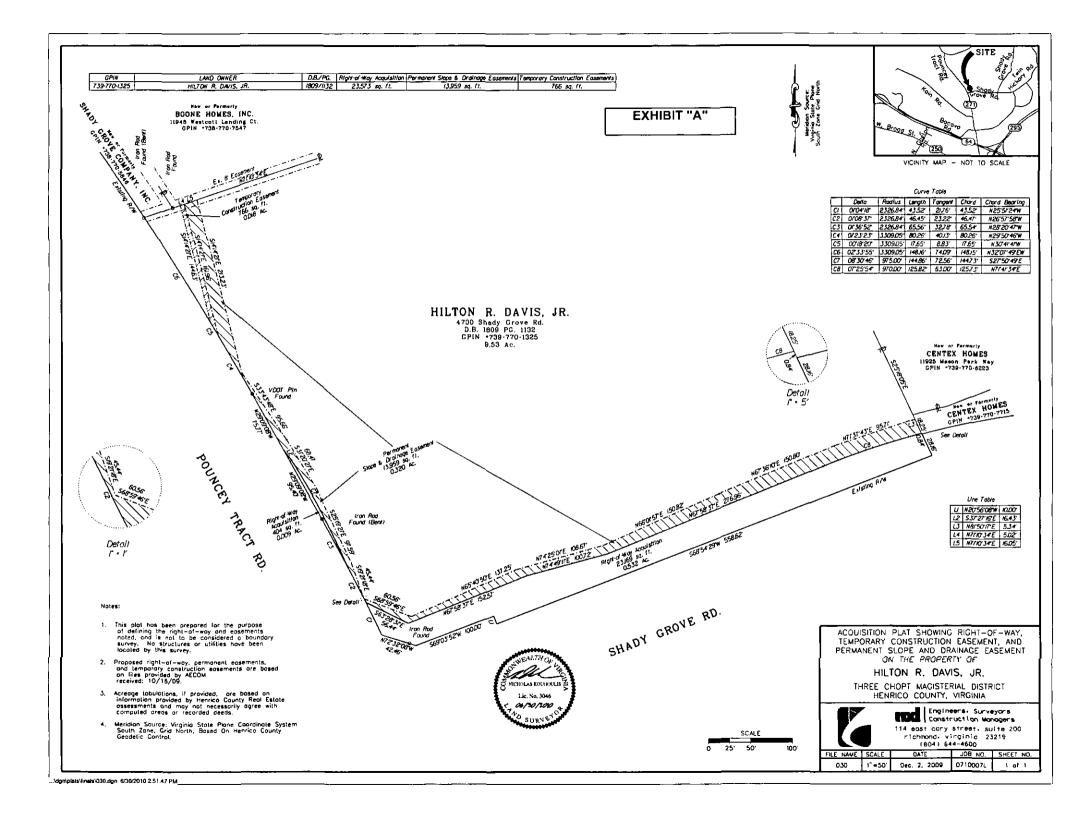
- (2) The Board deems it necessary to enter upon the property and take possession of the Rights-of-Way and Easements in order to construct the Project prior to the time in which a condemnation case can be filed and heard in accordance with the Code;

- (5) After the 30-day period for the Owner to contest the taking has run, the County Attorney shall file in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court a certificate signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the Board in accordance with the Code and shall deposit with the Clerk the amount of the bona fide offer listed below that has not been accepted by the Owner:

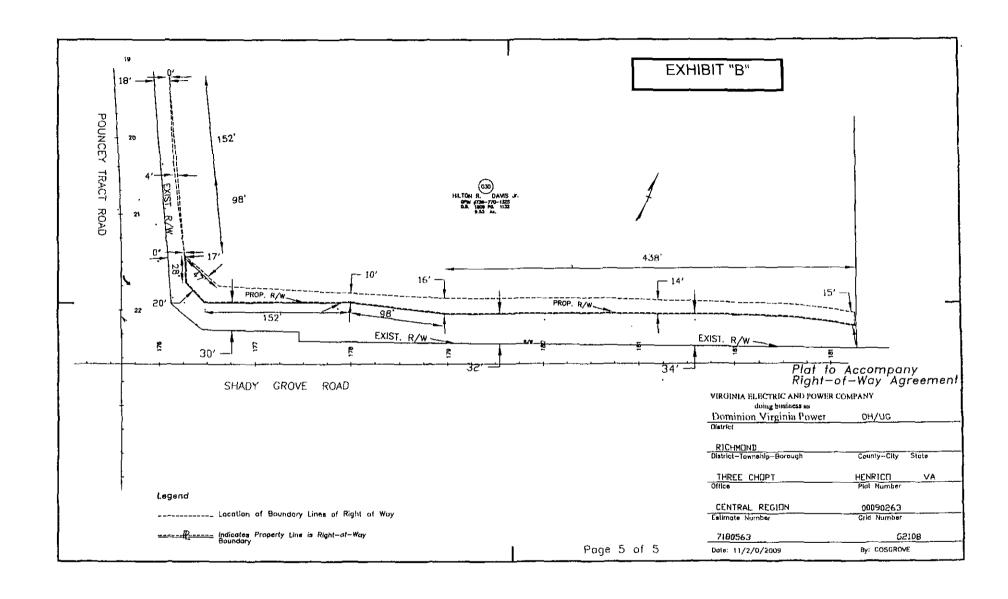

AN ORDINANCE adopting a recodification of the ordinances of the County of Henrico, Virginia, titled "The Code of the County of Henrico, Virginia of 2010."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

- 1. The Code titled "The Code of the County of Henrico, Virginia of 2010" (hereinafter "the Code") published by Municipal Code Corporation and consisting of Chapters 1 through 24, each inclusive, is adopted.
- 2. Unless another penalty is expressly provided, every violation of any provision of the Code or any ordinance, rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof, shall be punishable as a class 1 misdemeanor. Each act of violation and each day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. The penalty provided by this paragraph, unless another penalty is expressly provided, shall apply to the amendment of any Code section whether or not such penalty is reenacted in the amendatory ordinance. In addition to the penalty prescribed above, the County may pursue other remedies such as abatement of nuisances, injunctive relief, administrative adjudication and revocation of licenses or permits.
- Additions or amendments to the Code when passed in the form as to indicate the intention of the Board of Supervisors to make them a part of the Code shall be deemed to be incorporated in the Code, so that reference to the Code includes the additions and amendments.
- 4. Ordinances adopted between May 12, 2010 and December 31, 2010 that add a section or sections to the existing Code of the County of Henrico, Virginia, or that amend or refer to ordinances that have been codified in the Code shall be construed as if they add a section to the Code or amend or refer to like provisions of the Code.
- 5. This ordinance shall become effective January 1, 2011.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Sections 16-2, 16-31, and 16-37 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled, respectively, "Definitions," "Award of contracts generally," and "When protests not permitted," all relating to the award of contracts by the Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 16-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 16-2, Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

County means the County of Henrico, or the County School Board of Henrico County, or the Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board, as appropriate.

2. That Section 16-31 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 16-31. Award of contracts generally.

- (a) The director of general services shall award all contracts on behalf of the board of supervisors except for:
  - (1) Contracts for construction which are expected to exceed \$100,000.00;
  - (2) Contracts for professional services which are expected to exceed \$20,000.00; and
  - (3) Contracts where the director of general services, in his sole discretion, has determined that an award by the board of supervisors is appropriate and the request for proposal or invitation to bid states that the award of the proposed contract will be made by the board of supervisors.
- (b) The director of general services shall award all contracts on behalf of the school board except for:
  - (1) Contracts for Capital Project Fund work; and
  - (2) Contracts where the superintendent of schools, in his sole discretion, has determined that an award by the school board is appropriate and the request for proposal or invitation to bid states that the award of the proposed contract will be made by the school board.
- (c) The director of general services shall award all contracts on behalf of the Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board except for:
  - (1) Contracts for services for clients; and
  - (2) Contracts for goods for direct client use.
- (d) (e) The board of supervisors, or school board or Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board, as appropriate, shall award all contracts not awarded by the director of general services.

3. That Section 16-37 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

### Sec. 16-37. When protests not permitted.

- (a) No party who has unsuccessfully protested a decision to award may protest the subsequent award of the same contract.
- (b) No protest shall lie to a decision to award or an award made by the board of supervisors, or the school board or the Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board or a recommendation made by any person, selection committee or other entity to the board of supervisors, or the school board or the Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services Board concerning the award of a contract.
- 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.

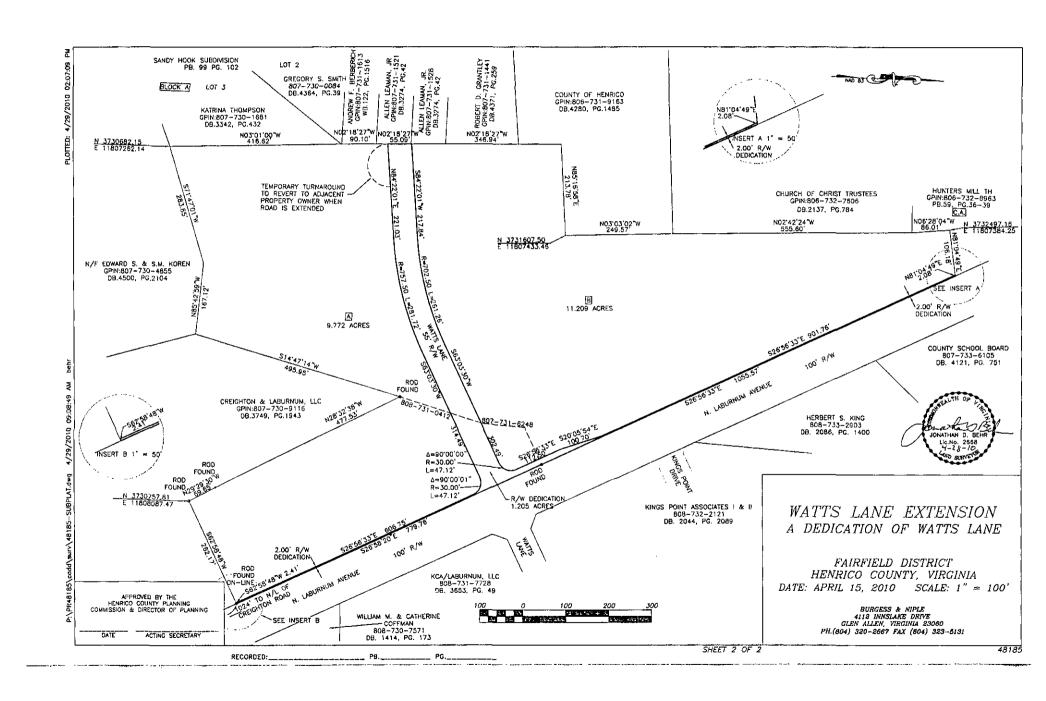
WATTS LANE EXTENSION A DEDICATION OF WATTS LANE

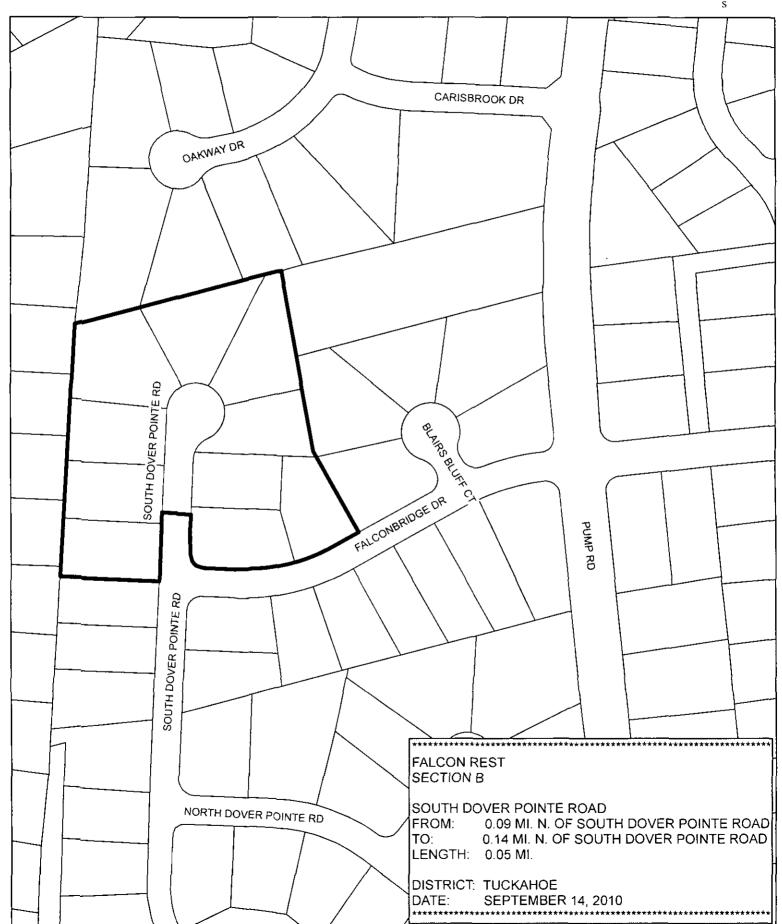
